# Fritz Scholder

(1937-2005)

One of the most talented artists of his generation, Fritz Scholder combines several ancestries and cultures, including Native American. He is the first one who demystified the embellished or fictitious image of Native Americans as portrayed by Anglo artists. His series of "Indians" were exhibited all across America and Europe. Interested in the occult and all forms of spirituality, Scholder built a complex body of work, sometimes challenging to the viewer, always intriguing and superbly executed. Scholder was a recipient of the MacArthur Genius Award, and of the Arizona and New Mexico Governors' Artist of the Year Awards.
